

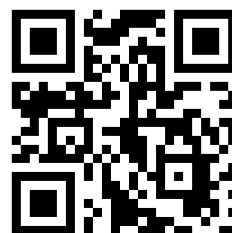
A major obstacle to increase the efficiency, effectiveness and quality of education in Europe is the lack of widely available, accessible, multilingual, timely, engaging and high-quality educational material (i.e. OpenCourseWare). The creation of comprehensive OpenCourseWare (OCW) is tedious, time-consuming and expensive with the effect that often courseware employed by teachers, instructors and professors is incomplete, outdated, inaccessible to those with disabilities and dull.



The SlideWiki Project

Objective is the creation of a platform that allows to

- Widely share (i.e. crowdsource) the effort of the creation and evolution of highly-structured remixable OCW
- Collaboratively create OCW (curricula, slide presentations, self-assessment tests, illustrations etc.) online
- Semi-automatically translate content into more than 50 languages and improve the translations collaboratively
- Support engagement and social networking of educators and learners around that content

The SlideWiki Platform

is a browser-based platform-independent tool. You can

- **Import** slides you have created with your usual tools
- **Create** slides
- **Share** your content (it is publicly visible)
- **Manage editing permissions** (some may edit, everybody can fork and reuse your slides)
- **Tag and search** for your content (knowledge communities)
- Create **Presentations Rooms** where participants switch back and forward between slides, ask questions like in a chat, and where the speaker can add subtitles or use interactive tools, such as surveys
